1	Reproductive Rights of Registered Nurses Handling Hazardous Drugs

3	WHEREAS:
4	
5	There is significant evidence indicating that hazardous drug handlers' exposure to
6	hazardous drugs in their daily work routine may affect their health; and
7	
8	Both animal and human studies have shown that exposure to hazardous drugs can lead to
9	reproductive health effects in health care workers handling these drugs and
10	developmental effects in their offspring; and
11	
12	Providing alternative duty is a recognized risk management strategy to protect the health
13	of these health care workers' offspring;
14	
15	THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the American Nurses Association will:
16	
17	Advocate that it is essential for all health care facilities to educate nurses who handle
18	hazardous drugs about the risk of reproductive and developmental effects that have been
19	associated with exposure to these drugs; and
20	
21	Actively advocate for the right of nurses to engage in alternative duty that does not
22	require hazardous drug handling when trying to conceive, when pregnant and when
23	breastfeeding.
