Being able to enhance its fellowship with infusion of diversity in culture, education, nursing philosophy, and experience, the Peak Vista Community Health Centers will continue to choose fellows who bring their own passion and commitment. "Because we are passionate and committed to what we do, currently 80 percent of our fellows remain at Peak Vista in family practice after the fellowship."

For anyone considering accrediting their practice transition program, Dr. Cullen advises to take it slow and use the process for program improvement. "We found out it isn't a sprint, it's a marathon," she said.

The APRN Fellowship can now use its new accreditation as part of the process with helping staff nurses to improve health care and access for people facing barriers to care. Proud of its recent accreditation, Peak Vista Community Health Centers looks to a brighter future and constant focus on the improvement process. "More important to us than the accomplishment was what we learned along the way to improve our program." said Cullen.
